



Appendix 1 Behaviour policy - Returning to school, September 2020 (COVID-19)

Expectations of parents/Carers

- ONLY 1 Parent/Carer to arrive at school site to bring child (ren) to school.
- Pre-school children to stay with Parent/Carer at all times (e.g. buggy, holding hands, reigns.)
- Parents to stay in their own vehicles when dropping children off at school.
- Children to meet their class teacher on the Churchyard and line up sensibly, complying with the social distancing rules.
- Ensure social distance from other adults whilst waiting for teachers to come out to the children - as per government guidance (please do not arrive too early to avoid congregation.)
- Parents/Carers are not to enter school building - especially classrooms.
- Any messages for the teacher need to either be made via Dojo, email or through the office. Face to face conversations with the teacher will not be able to take place.
- Collect your child as Soon as Possible (ASAP) if called regarding illness/symptoms.
- Stick to allocated drop off/pick up times based on your child's year group.
- Parents/carers to collect child if not adhering to NO TOUCHING rules (reminders given prior to this.)

Expectations of Children

- Normal behaviour rules/rewards/sanctions apply - 'All Saints Code of conduct.'
- Children should stay at a social distance as much as possible (adults in school to remind children when necessary.)
- Children should not play games that include touching others (e.g. tag, stuck in the mud etc...)

- Children not sticking to the NO TOUCHING rules will be reminded and parents informed to support with reinforcement.
- Children to line up at a social distance in school when asked.
- Children to enter the building separately and patiently.
- Children will not line up/congregate on the courtyard.
- Children to wash hands/sanitise when entering the building and at regular intervals throughout the day.
- Any coughing/spitting on another pupil will result in being sent home.
- Children to follow any signs and special routes in place (e.g. one-way system.)
- Only use your own water bottle and do not share equipment.
- Children to stay in their own "zone" on the playground based on year group.
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose and eyes and follow the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' advice.
- Children cannot congregate in the bathroom, children will use different/ separate bathrooms and facilities where necessary.

Behaviour sanctions protocol

1. Verbal reminder - A reminder about behaviour choice.
2. Name recorded on the whiteboard - with a warning.
3. Loss of break time/lunch time play (or minutes deducted.)
4. Reported to SLT.
5. Phone call home and parents contacted.
6. In an emergency situation, a senior member of staff may be called for.
