We continued to think about St Paul, who found God, and he wrote lots and lots of letters. In another of his letters he wrote, "always give thanks to God

the father." Mr Sutton shared how people have thanked him and he brought in some cards to share with the children. He asked the children if they had a meal this week that someone else had made for them. The children shared some of the people who had cooked their meals, whether this was at home or from outside the home. We discussed that before eating we can say grace. Grace is a prayer we thank God for the food we have.



Next Mrs Sutton shared a story of some children who complained about the food they were about to have for lunch, whilst the story was being told pictures of hungry children were being shared around the children. The children in the story weren't happy about some of the food choice and water to drink and complained. This made us think about being thankful for any food or drink we may receive as Mr

Sutton shared some statistics with us:

300 million children go to bed hungry every day and 400 million children in the world don't have access to clean water. 75,000 tones are thrown away in Britain from supermarkets. In our houses we throw away 20% of the food we have. We all agreed that we are thankful for not going to bed hungry and that we have clean water.

Finally, we finished with worship team leading us in our school prayer.


