Headteacher's Message

Welcome back! I hope that you have all had a peaceful and chocolate-filled Easter holidays! The children have returned to school eager to learn and happy to see their teachers and friends.

This week, we have taken part in the NSPCC 'Speak Out Stay Safe' project — each Key Stage has had their own assembly and has completed follow-up activities based on these. The project has been so effective in teaching children their right to be heard and to stay safe. It has also signposted them towards places they can go for help and support. Next week, Year 5 and 6 will be taking part in a live workshop on Monday afternoon which will be run by the NSPCC - please look out for an information letter attached. We are determined to ensure that safeguarding is held at the very centre of everything we do at All Saints with many more updates to follow.

We started our week with a visit from a Maths consultant, Vanessa Brown, who is from Inspiring Maths Education. She spent a day with myself and our maths lead, Mrs Shale, where we looked at Maths teaching and learning across the school. It really was a pleasure to see how hard the children work and how well organised they are in Maths lessons. Vanessa has given us some great ideas for how we can continue to improve Maths at All Saints.

We also had a lovely visit from the new Headteacher at St Leonards in Dunston, Catherine Phillips. She loved being shown round our school and we talked about the similarities our two schools share. We are going to be putting our heads together again very soon to find ways we can work together on things such as moderation and different events for the children.

On Thursday, our PE lead, Mrs Gardiner visited to talk to us about plans for break times and also National School's Sport week. Please see more details from Mrs Gliddon further in the newsletter. **Sports Day this year will be on Wednesday 21st June in the afternoon,** parents are invited to join their children for a picnic lunch from 12 noon and then stay for our sports activities from 1pm.

Today we have had a few of our children that belong to organisations, come to school dressed in their uniforms to celebrate St George's Day that falls this Sunday. Thank you Leo and Lydia – we really enjoyed hearing about the promises that you have made and the many badges you have earned. I think we can all agree that you looked very smart and we are very proud of you.

Finally, the staff have had a planning meeting today for the King's Coronation. We will be having a whole school celebration on Friday 5th May. More details to follow.

Sparrows

Our topic this half term is 'Let's go to Mexico!'

In Geography we will be finding out about where Mexico is, what the weather is like there and why. We will be comparing Mexico to the United Kingdom and learning about how different the culture is there.

In Design Technology we will be completing a cooking and nutrition unit, looking at what foods originate from Mexico and we will be making typical Mexican dishes whilst considering the basic principles of a balanced and varied diet. This will link in perfectly with our RSE topic of keeping our bodies healthy.

In PE we will be outdoors taking part in athletics. Children will therefore need to wear red, grey or black shorts/joggers, red PE T-shirts and a school hoodie or sweatshirt. They will also need to wear white or black trainers, no pumps as we may be on the field.

In our RE lessons we will be finding out about the church and how Christians speak to God.

Music will continue to use our Charanga scheme and this half terms unit is called 'round and round.'

In Science we will be learning about animals including humans. We will be finding out about and naming different kinds of animals and naming those that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. We will be developing our scientific skills too.

We will be continuing Show and Tell on Wednesday afternoons to develop speaking and listening and confidence skills.

To complete our topic and bring all of our knowledge and skills together, we will be holding a Mexican Fiesta! We will be making Mexican food, listening to Mexican music, smashing piñatas and learning a Mexican hat dance! We'd love children to dress up in traditional sombrero and ponchos or Spanish style dresses - more details to follow.

We can't wait to keep you updated on our learning over the next 6 weeks.

Doves



English: we will be focussing on adding adverbs, adverbials and fronted adverbials to a variety of sentence types using the book 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman as a stimulus! We will use our newly learned skills to write a 5 part narrative and an explanation text linked to Volcanoes. We will continue extending our Reading VIPERS skills during our reading lessons.

Maths: We will start the term by continuing and consolidating the children's knowledge of fractions. Following on from this, Year 3 will be moving on to a unit on Mass & Capacity whilst Year 4 will be learning about decimal numbers, linking this new learning to what they learned about fractions last term.

Science: Doves will discover the different types of rocks and how they are formed. They will compare and group rocks based on appearance and simple properties. They will learn how fossils are formed and learn about the contribution of Mary Anning to the field of palaeontology. They will understand how soil is formed and then investigate the permeability of different types of soil.

Geography: Linking to our past learning of Mount Vesuvius, this half term we will learn about the destructive powers of nature, from volcanoes and earthquakes to tsunamis and tornadoes. Through discussion and practical tasks, children will learn about how and why these natural phenomena occur, and the ways in which they affect people and the environment.

Computing: The children will be learning about desktop publishing in Computing this half term. They will learn to add text and images to create their own pieces of work using desktop publishing software, making careful decisions about style, size and colour. They will also consider how and why desktop publishing is used in the real world.

RE: Our RE unit this half term is called 'The Kingdom of God'. In this unit, the children will be learning to make links between the story of the Day of Pentecost and Christian belief about the Kingdom of God on Earth. They will be thinking about the Holy Spirit, the Kingdom of God, and how Christians live their whole lives and in their church communities. They will be attempting to answer the big question: When Jesus left, what was the impact of Pentecost?

Music: In Music lessons, the children's learning will be based on a song called 'Bringing us Together'. This is a disco-style track about friendship, peace, hope and unity. The children will learn about the typical features of disco music through singing and performing.

Art: This half term, the children will be learning about Andy Warhol and the wonderful world of pop art. They will start by studying his piece entitled 'Vesuvius' and comparing it their own Vesuvius compositions from last term inspired by David Hockney. They will then be creating some Pop Art of their own with a special Coronation Day twist.

For our Monday PE lesson, we will develop basic running, jumping and throwing techniques. Our second PE lesson of the week will be on Wednesdays when we will continue going swimming.

In French, the children will learn to talk about animals and describe their colour and movement, while listening and responding to a story.

Eagles

This term we are reading 'Clockwork' by Philip Pullman as part of our guided reading sessions. In our English lessons we will be creating a brochure selling the place, Glockinheim, writing a letter as Prince Otto and writing a balanced argument 'Did Karl deserve to die?' also based around this text.

In Maths Year 5 will be working on perimeter, statistics, position and direction and shape. Year 6 will be working on Area, perimeter, volume, statistics and shape. Please keep practicing the timetables on TTRock Stars!

Our whole school theme this half term is 'All Fired Up!

In Geography, we are learning about Contrasting Climates looking at rainforests, climate zones, biomes and vegetation belts.

For Science, we will be learning about life cycles of mammals, amphibians and birds.

In DT, we will be looking at what hats are suitable for different climates, designing paper hats and even sewing our own hat.

In our Music lessons, we will be listening and appreciating 'You've got a Friend' as well as learning to sing the song and playing instruments alongside. We will also continue to have ukulele lessons.

For RSE, we will be completing our money topic before starting on 'What affects our mental health' and ways to take care if it; managing change, loss and bereavement, managing time online.

In RE, the children will be learning about the Kingdom of God and answering the big question 'What kind of King is Jesus?' Relating Christian teachings or beliefs about God's Kingdom to the issues, problems and opportunities of their own lives and the life of their own community.

In Computing, the children will be using Vector Graphics to draw a variety of pictures.

For PE, we will be developing flexibility, strength, techniques, control and balance in Gymnastics and in Athletics, we will be running, jumping throwing and catching in preparation for our sports day.

In French, we will continue to speak and write in French - Vive Le Sport!

Good luck to the Year 6s in their SATs!

We are really looking forward to another exciting term of learning! Let's hope the sun shines!



Dear Parent/Carer,

We are pleased to tell you that this term we will be participating in the N\$PCC's Speak out. Stay safe. online programme. This consists of an online assembly and supporting classroom based activities. Speak out. Stay safe. is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel Islands. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline.

In the online assembly, the *Speak out. Stay safe*, messages are delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot Buddy as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec.

Following-on from the assembly, our specially trained NSPCC volunteers will also be delivering a workshop to our Year 5/6 children that will build-on and deepen pupils' learning gained from the assembly.

We have studied the content of the materials and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of the programme, we're convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.


On Friday 05th May we will be celebrating the coronation of King Charles III and are planning lots of lovely activities for the children during the morning.
