Our Wildlife Wednesday was all about seeds - how they can help our wildlife and how our wildlife can help them! Whilst talking about the different ways that animals can help to disperse seeds, we were joined (right on cue) by a flock of sheep! It was almost as if it was planned! The children then undertook a series of seed-related

activities: they identified (and drew) different types of seeds, they dissected a seed to observe the coat, the baby plant (embryo) and the food (cotyledon) and then learned about germination by planting their very own oak trees! Let's hope some of them grow and that you've all got room in your gardens!

Following the fantastic parental feedback about the enrichment days children experienced last academic year, we have organised a further experience for each half term of the school year. ### 29th September 2023 - Greatest Showman Confidence Building

This enrichment day teaches the children a variety of new skills and tricks whilst focusing on improving their self-esteem and confidence. Celebrating what they can already do and their creative ideas and encouraging their resilience and perseverance in practising new things.





## 30<sup>th</sup> November 2023 - Archery


# 11th July 2024 - Inclusive Olympic Games


We will be taking a collection towards Christian Aid's project to help small farms in Malawi suffering from severe climate changes – please bring some cash!
