# \$parrows

In Maths this half term Year 1 are focusing on place value within 50 and then moving on to length and height. In Year 2 we are continuing to work on multiplication and division. The Year 2 Sparrows have started to use the multiplication symbol in their Maths lessons this week and today they were confident enough to complete questions independently on TT Rockstars.

In English this half term our quality text is 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark'. This is a lovely book featuring an owl who learns about all the wonderful things that happen at night. In Year 1 we are focusing on pronouns and personal pronouns. In Year 2 we are consolidating previous learning on pronouns and personal pronouns as well as adding additional conjunctions to our vocabulary to use in compound sentences. In English we are working towards creating a fact file in Year 1 and a non-chronological report in Year 2.

In History we will be covering a unit called 'How was school different in the past?' They will be building on previous learning about our Victorian school by looking at historical similarities and differences. Children will be using a range of sources to recognise continuity between children's lives past and present.

Through the power of God's love children will reach their full potential and be able to live their lives with an open mind so that they can learn from the world around them.

In Science children will be studying food chains to complete their learning of animals and their habitats and moving on to looking at Seasonal Change.

In Art, Sparrows will be exploring colour mixing using a range of tools and surfaces and creating paintings in the style of Clarice Cliff. (One of Mrs Scott's favourite artists!)

For RE, we will be completing the unit of Salvation by finding out why Easter matters to Christians.

In PE we are continuing with Gymnastics at Acton Trussell Community Centre. Please note - children who cannot tie laces really need Velcro trainers until they are competent with laces as this is causing issues each week trying to get knots out when we need to be on the bus!

In Computing, Sparrows are using Purple Mash to create animated story books.

Finally, in Music this half term we are completing the 'Zoo Time' unit of Charanga.



#### Doves

In History this half term, Doves are answering the question - Why did the Roman's settle in Britain? They will be learning about the reaction of the Celts on the Romans invasion of Britain and learning how Romans changed life in Britain.

In Science, we will be looking at materials and in particular Rocks and soil.

In Art we will be completing a drawing unit where we will be developing an understanding of shading and drawing techniques.

In computing, Doves will be learning about animation through Purple Mash.

In French the children will be completing the unit Portraits.

In RE children will learning to answer the question - How do Christians remember Jesus' last supper? They will also be leading the Easter service in church on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March.

Finally, in PE Doves are completing a unit of tennis and will also have their weekly swimming lesson.

# Eagles

Here is everything you need to know about the content we will be covering in Eagles this half term. Our Spring 2 topic is "Invade and Rule."

#### **English & Guided Reading**

Our new text is "Private Peaceful" by Michael Morpurgo, a classic novel set in World War I. Our fictional writing focus will be diary writing (in role) and our non-fiction writing will be linked to our history "World War I & II" topic. Our Grammar lessons will provide children with the development of skills to implement within their writing such as: complex sentences, subordinating conjunctions, relative clauses, colons, and semi-colons.

### <u>Maths</u>

Year 5: Fractions, Multiplication and Division (Part 2) and Decimals & Percentages

Year 6: Fractions, Converting units and ratio. (Plus Beginning of SATS prep)

# **History**

In History, we will be focusing on the impact of WWII on the people of Britain. The children will be investigating the causes of WW2; learning about the Battle of Britain; investigating the impact of the Blitz and evacuation on people's lives; and evaluating the effectiveness of primary sources.

#### Science

Our focus this half term is "Materials, Mixtures and Separation" including exploring different types of mixtures and the different methods that can be used to separate them. The children will dissolve a range of substances, identify different solutions, and investigate how temperature affects the time taken to dissolve. The class will design and create a water filter, sieve soil, and evaporate solutions.

#### Art

Craft and Design: Developing photography skills and techniques to design a range of creative photographic outcomes.

#### Computing

In our computing lessons, we will be looking at all things spreadsheets! Learning how to create the formulas, use the programming effectively and create and represent data.

This half term we are excited to launch our new "Happy Mind" scheme which will teach the children all about how their individual brains work and how this can impact their emotions, feelings and actions.

#### Music


Year 5 will take part in weekly ukulele lessons on a Thursday morning. As a whole class we will be working through Charanga music progression.

We will have our dressing up day on Monday 4th March when our school theme for day is "Alice in Wonderland", although we are happy for children to come to school dressed as ANY book character of choice. We also have a visitor coming in to speak to the children about an exciting sponsored readathon to launch the week.

On World Book Day itself (7th March) we have an exciting Enrichment Day planned where the children will be taking part in Alice in Wonderland themed activities. As this is a dance/PE style session, all children will need to wear PE kit and sensible shoes for health and safety reasons. Finally, throughout the week, the children will take part in Alice in Wonderland themed lessons for English, Art, Drama.

As usual we will be celebrating Red Nose Day at All Saints on Friday 15th March.

The children will be encouraged to wear something red and we will be using 'BBC Comedy Classroom' to help us learn how to write some really funny jokes.

We will be having a competition where the School Council will judge the best joke at All Saints and attached is a link in case anyone wants some advice on how to create the perfect joke! We will post more information as we get closer to the 15th March.



We started exploring map skills this week. We imagined an aerial view of Bednall and drew our own map that included the school, playground, church, roads and field. We then compared our map drawings to google maps to see how accurate our perceptions were! We identified the different human (man-made) and physical (natural) features and discussed how these may change over time. Finally, we looked at different map symbols to see how many we could identify - we did pretty well!
