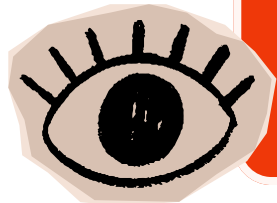


Classroom Moments

Exploring, learning, and growing together—one day, one lesson, and one success at a time!



Since returning back from the Christmas, we're proud of our students for their effort and enthusiasm in every activity. Looking at our school values which one of them is "Hope", we are teaching them to understand persevere and not giving up, to keep going. When learning feels hard, hope is what keeps them trying again. We are teaching pupils not to give up when progress is slow. Here's a quick look at what we've been up to.



Little Robins

The children embraced their creativity and imagination by wrapping up warm and becoming "polar explorers," venturing outside to hunt for hidden Arctic animals such as polar bears. Also learning about hibernation, "sleepy bears" making bear caves. Describing how they feel by using adjectives.



Sparrows

Have been developing their understanding of nouns and adjectives, using them to describe the Arctic and its animals through the story Lost and Found. In English, Year 1 and 2 pupils have been learning how to use proper nouns when writing simple sentences, linked to the story Bog Baby. The class also thoroughly enjoyed their recent visit to Ironbridge Enginuity. During Wildlife Wednesday, pupils loved collecting natural materials to create their own bear caves.

Doves

In English, the children have been developing their writing skills by accurately adding speech to a story about a young girl who had to pick tea in India while caring for her mother. In Maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division. In our Topic work, we have been learning about sound and exploring our local area through map work. We also thoroughly enjoyed our school trip to Enginuity, which was a fantastic learning experience for all.

Eagles

Have shown great perseverance in Mathematics while working on long division. In English, pupils have been exploring setting descriptions and learning how to use subordination to enhance their writing. In their wider curriculum learning, they have been studying the importance of our oceans, understanding the damage caused by human activity and discussing ways we can help to protect them.

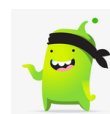
